STRONACH BIDS FOR SHARE IN FAVORITE

TRICK Discussions continued yesterday between Frank Stronach and the current owners of juvenile champion-elect **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) which would allow the undefeated colt to remain with trainer Pat Byrne. According to Byrne, Stronach has made an offer to Joseph LaCombe and Walmac Farm to buy a share in the three-year-old. If the offer is taken, Byrne, who has been hired as Stronach's private trainer, will keep the colt in his barn. "I don't exactly know the details, but something is pending and something is in the works," said Byrne. Favorite Trick is currently in training in Ocala, but could arrive at Byrne's Gulfstream stable as early as today. "Joe (LaCombe) wants me to get the colt here and back in regular training," said Byrne. "There's a van leaving (Saturday), and I might try and get him on it." Stronach is also interested in buying a share in four-year-old **Panama City** (El Gran Senor), who Byrne saddled to take the GII W.L. McKnight H. at Calder December 20 for LaCombe and Robert Sangster.

ECLIPSE AWARDS FOR WRITING ANNOUNCED

Bill Heller, a free-lance writer and three-time winner of the John Hervey Award for the best magazine writing in harness racing, has added the 1997 Eclipse Award for Outstanding Achievement in Magazine Writing to his credits, while Maryjean Wall, also a three-time John Hervey Award winner who was honored with her first Eclipse in 1980, has picked up her second, taking the 1997 Award for Outstanding Achievement in Newspaper Writing. Wall, racing writer for the *Lexington Herald-Leader* and a contributor to the *Thoroughbred Daily News*, won for her story "A Living Flame," about the great Man o'War. Heller won his award for an article entitled "The Times They Are a-Changin'," a piece about the careers of trainers David Whiteley and John Veitch which appeared in *The Backstretch*. Honorable mentions for magazine writing went to *TDN* contributor Frank Carlson, Sean Clancy, David Heckerman, Jay Hovdey and Bill Mooney. Honorable mentions in the newspaper category went to Bill Handleman, Jennie Rees, Gene Stevens, and to Stephanie Diaz, who won for both newspaper and magazine writing in 1995, but had her magazine award stripped after a lengthy investigation into her writing practices.

NEW YORK IN-HOME SIMULCASTING

DISPUTE CONTINUES The New York Racing Association, unable to reach an agreement with New York City Off-Track Betting, cut off its in-home simulcast signal to New York City yesterday, but shortly before post time for the second race the signal was restored. NYC OTB officials petitioned the New York Supreme Court in the matter, which ordered NYRA to resume sending the signal until the state's Racing and Wagering Board has completed its arbitration of the dispute. Unless it gets a large increase in compensation from NYC OTB, NYRA is hoping to end in-home simulcasting in New York City permanently. According to Terry Meyocks, president and COO of NYRA, "In-home simulcasting has had a seriously damaging effect on horse racing in New York State. New York is the only state which has created two separate entities with two separate ownerships—one that produces racing and one that retails racing—which has created deep-seated conflicting objectives." In-home simulcasting in New York City began March 1, 1995, and since that time NYRA contends it has lost \$12.8 million in foregone pari-mutuel and admission revenues, which was partially offset by \$5.5 million in payments from NYC OTB. Attendance at Belmont and Aqueduct over the 34-month period was down 24 percent. "Our goal is to provide the best possible racing in the best possible facilities at the most reasonable prices for our fans," said Meyocks. "Without a more fair and equitable solution, NYRA will be unable to reach these goals. Without increasing on-track business, NYRA races will not be able to attract the best horses or the top owners, trainers and jockeys because our purses will not compete with those of other racing jurisdictions."

Ladies Din began his career in the claiming ranks and was haltered for \$32,000 after breaking his maiden in his second start, but has climbed the ladder swiftly since. Trying the turf for the first time in his debut under new management, the bay captured a Del Mar allowance in September, and followed with a second in the grassy Pinjara S. at Santa Anita October 17. First under the wire in his latest, the Precisionist S. at Hollywood November 6, the gelding was disqualified and placed fifth, but bounced right back here. The crowd's 6-5 choice settled outside while just off the pace for six furlongs, came with a four-wide sweep on the final bend and outfinished rank outsider Del Mar Dancer for his first stakes score. "He's going to be a very nice horse," said trainer Julio Canani. "He's so immature, he's like a little kid. He's still learning." Local News: England

Ending weeks of speculation, leading British bookmakers Ladbrokes have stepped in to buy out their long-time rivals Corals from the Bass Group. Ladbrokes purchased the 833 Coral betting shops for 375,500,000 pounds sterling (approximately \$631,942,100). The purchase would have taken the number of off-track shops which they control in Britain to more than 2,750. However, Ladbrokes have agreed in principle to sell 128 of their shops to the Tote, which controls pool betting in Britain, for 41-million pounds (approximately \$69,000,336), thus reducing their total number of shops to approximately 2,630. Once this deal has been finalized, the Tote will operate some 450 shops across Britain.
