CALDER WRAP-UP Calder closed out its final meet of the season Friday with the first Derby of the New Year, as Fred Hooper's homebred **Draw Again** (Roman Diplomat) captured the GIII Tropical Park Derby, and Hooper, now 100 years old, was in the winner's circle to accept the trophy. The meet was a winner for the track as well, as total on-track attendance for the 51-day Tropical meeting was 274,607, up slightly from last year, and total handle was \$211,413,213, up 11 percent from the 1996/97 season. Jockey Eibar Coa won his fourth consecutive riding title with 59 wins. Carlos Morales led the trainer standings, taking his first U.S. title with 20 victories. Sheila Arnold was the leading owners with 11 winners. Calder will open for its 28th season of racing May 23, 1998.

DIVINE FORCE HUMBLER LONDON NEWS

South Africa's reigning Horse Of The Year **London News** (SAf) (Bush Telegraph {SAf}) failed in his attempt to win back-to-back runnings of the G1 \$61,786 Queen's Plate over a mile at Kenilworth in The Cape Saturday. The champ was beaten four lengths, finishing fourth behind **Divine Force** (SAf) (Divine King {Ire}). Trained by David Ferraris and ridden by stable jockey Pierre Strydom, five-year-old entire Divine Force, a 7-1 shot, was well in the rear for the first half-mile with London News sitting second, but he finished like a bullet and won going away by two lengths. The five-year-old mare **Faralmond** (Arg) (Farnesio {Arg}) was second, with last year's Cape Derby winner **Shah's Star** (SAf) (Foveros {GB}) the same margin away third. London News, the 15-10 favourite, was another short head back in fourth. This was Divine Force's second major win this season, having taken the valuable G2 Premier's H., also over a mile, in September.

Sir Cat was not bothered when this race was taken off the grass after capturing two consecutive off-the-turf events, the Nov. 1 GIII Knickerbocker H. at Aqueduct and the Nov. 29 GIII Tropical Turf H. at Calder. The public choice was rated on the front end along the inside and increased his margin at the top of the stretch to win under a hand ride. "He's probably good either way (on or off the turf)," winning jockey Jerry Bailey said. "It looked like he had as much speed as anybody else. We had the inside post and rather than give up position, Billy (winning trainer Mott) and I decided to go with him." Trainer Bill Mott did not mind the change of surface, either. "I would have been happy either way," Mott said. "This way we only had a third of the horses to beat. I imagine some of the horses scratched because they didn't have time to change shoes. I shipped Sir Cat over in toes grabs, so we didn't have to change. We would have just filed off the toe grabs if the race stayed on the turf." (Gulfstream Park implemented a flat shoe policy on the turf course this year). Mott indicated that the winner may run next in the Jan. 24 GIII Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream and will stand at stud in Maryland for his new owner Richard L. Golden when his racing career is done.

Rare Rock, sixth in the Nov. 29 GI Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct last out, dropped back in distance and scored for the first time since winning his third straight, an Oct. 10 Keeneland allowance contest, following his return from a 10 1/2-month layoff in August. "He's doing super. The Broward H. (GIII, January 10) is a possibility for him," said trainer Robert Durso. "I'm not sure yet. I may wait until the Deputy Minister on January 18. He's coming into his four-year-old year great, maturing nicely." The colt finished his 1997 campaign with a second-place finish in the Indiana Derby at Hoosier Park October 4.

Also working Saturday, **Chip (Norquestor),** undefeated in three Gulfstream stakes last year, went five furlongs in :59 2/5. Off since finishing third in the GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. at Monmouth Park June 8, the five-year-old could make her return in the GIII First Lady H. January 14.

Canadian invader Cheers and Tears won a Dec. 6 Aqueduct allowance contest by two lengths in her New York debut last time out. The third choice stepping up to stakes company, the dark bay set a contested pace before shaking loose from favored Kanwiaga turning for home and drawing away in the stretch. "At the quarter-pole, I knew I was going to win it," said jockey Oliver Castillo, an apprentice winning his second stakes. "I had so much horse underneath me and even on the backside she wasn't straining herself at all. She won easily. To win a stakes in New York is a great rush, because everyone in the world is watching." Added trainer Joe Orseno, "We expected a big effort and we got it. She has run two solid races for us and has done everything right at this point. She's a young filly and she's getting better. She has a future ahead of her."

A stakes winner on both turf and dirt in 1997, Madame Pandit was coming off a fourth-place finish in the Desert Stormer H. on the Hollywood main track November 8. Sent off the second choice when this race came off the grass, the dark bay mare dueled with BLUE BEGONIA (Seeking the Gold) through a half in :44 1/5, opened up a clear lead at the top of the stretch and galloped home to a decisive score. "Last time I got her in back of horses and she started climbing," said regular rider Eddie Delahoussaye. "So I figured I'd better get her in the race. Once I got her head up with the rest of them, she relaxed pretty good. I just let her do her thing and she really kicked on at the end." Trainer Ron McAnally indicated the winner would point for the GI Santa Monica H. January 24. The 4-5 favorite, Desert Stormer H. winner ADVANCING STAR (Soviet Star) who bested the boys in the Gili Hollywood Turf Express H. in her latest, pressed the pace but weakened and finished fifth. "She uncharacteristically threw in the towel very early," said her rider, Kent Desormeaux. "She feels great, very sound. The wheels are good, but she didn't run at all. She never took a step in the right direction." Added trainer Richard Mandella, "Every time I run her here when it's rained, or is threatening rain, she hasn't run good. I think she smells it. She can get a half in :43 and change easy, and today they went in :44 and change. She just wasn't getting hold of the track."
