TIMBER COUNTRY JOINS ARROWFIELD

ROSTER Timber Country (Woodman), a champion two-year-old in the U.S. and hero of the '94 Breeders' Cup Juvenile and '95 Preakness, will shuttle to Australia from Japan to stand the Southern Hemisphere season at Arrowfield Stud. The six-year-old, purchased by Shadai Corporation, was syndicated in Japan for \$16.6 million; he stands at Shadai Stallion Station for 5 million yen (\$38,940). His Australian stud fee has not been set. "We are delighted to shuttle a stallion like Timber Country," said Arrowfield Chairman John Messara. "The competition in the Australian market has meant that we can now only afford to take horses of the highest class. Timber Country is most definitely such a horse. He will serve a strictly limited book of 79 mares."

DAWSON'S LEGACY BACK ON TRACK

Canadian juvenile champ Dawson's Legacy (Roanoke), who came down with a virus after an allowance win at Gulfstream January 3, is still possible for the GII Fountain of Youth February 21. "He hasn't breezed yet, but he's been out galloping every day," said trainer Rita Schnitzler of the three-year-old, who was second in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "We'll give him another week and if he looks like he's coming around, we'll breeze him and then decide. If he doesn't go in the Fountain of Youth, he'll go in the Florida Derby (March 14), just go straight in. We're not going to push him. I don't want to see him drop off when he's just starting to come back properly. There are still a lot of good races ahead of us. He's starting to feel good--bucking and jumping around."

Champion three-year-old sprinter General Nediym (Aus) will now attempt to become only the second horse in Australian racing history to win the four premier Autumn sprint races. His next target will be the G1 Oakleigh Plate over five-and-a-half furlongs at Caulfield on February 21, followed by the G1 Newmarket H. over six furlongs at Flemington on March 7 and the G1 The Galaxy S. over five-and-a-half furlongs at Randwick on April 13. Only Schillaci (Aus) in 1992 has previously achieved this feat. General Nediym, winner of 10 of his 12 lifetime starts, has now won over \$900,000.

Away smoothly, Big Sunday (Jpn) took the lead at the start and made all the running, finishing strongly to hold favored Prest Symboli (Ire) safe to the wire. It was the second straight victory for the winner, who captured the 70th Anniversary New Year S. at Nakayama January 6 in his latest. "The plan was to chase horses if anyone else tried to take the lead, but no one did," said jockey Masayoshi Ebina. "He started to lose interest in the middle stage of the race, but when they almost caught up with us, he started to fight again."
