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DEVIL'S CUP CONNECTIONS FILE SUIT

AGAINST GULFSTREAM Gold Spur Stable, owners of graded-stakes winner **Devil's Cup** (Devil's Bag) who was euthanized last October 23, filed a civil law suit in Broward County Court on March 11 against Gulfstream Park Racing Association. Devil's Cup fractured his right front sesamoid in the GIII Ft. Lauderdale H. while racing over the rain-soaked Gulfstream turf course March 15, 1997. The following day, four horses, three of them runners in the featured GII Orchid H., were injured while competing on the Gulfstream grass, and the final two races on the card were moved to the main track after jockeys refused to ride over the course. Two of those horses were also euthanized: **Turk Passer** (Turkoman), a Grade I stakes winner running in a \$62,500 claiming race that day, broke down going into the far turn and was put down immediately, while Orchid runner **Look Daggers** (Diesis {GB}) was euthanized last May 30 from complications resulting from her injuries. Devil's Cup was moved to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky and arthrodesis surgery to fuse his right ankle was performed in May. When Devil's Cup was put down in October, Alan Quartucci said, "...there were complications from the surgery that couldn't be overcome." Joel Fass, attorney for Gold Spur and Quartucci, their managing partner, said, "We will ask for in excess of \$1 million for Devil's Cup, plus another \$40,000 in expenses that Mr. Quartucci put out above the \$70,000 his insurance company paid to keep the horse alive. We filed an initial discovery motion asking for the records of the track's policies concerning whose decision it was to leave races on the turf course or who took them off, percolation tests that were taken and who walked the course to check for safety." Fass said he expected the case to take a year to move through the court system. Lawyer Gene Kubicki, representing Gulfstream Park in the case, did not return phone calls to his office.

MONMOUTH MEET Monmouth Park's 1998 stakes schedule was released yesterday, highlighted by the \$1 million GI Buick Haskell Invitational on Sunday, August 9. The 15-event schedule is worth \$2.8 million.

"Monmouth Park has always been the place to showcase racing's top performers," said Robert J. Kulina, vice president of Monmouth Park. "We have great expectations our '98 stakes schedule will carry on that rich tradition." Fourteen of the 15 stakes are graded. The meet features three Grade II races, the \$250,000 Philip H. Iselin H. on August 30, the \$200,000 Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup on July 4 and the \$200,000 Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks on July 11. Fifty-one overnight stakes will also be run during the 77-day meet which runs from May 23 through Sept. 7.

INGLIS & SON YEARLING SALES RESULTS At yesterday's first session of the William Inglis and Son 1998 Premier Yearling Sale at Oaklands in Melbourne, Australia, top price was paid for hip number 89, a filly by Zabeel (NZ)--Silver Fleet (NZ) (Silver Dream {GB}). ROCKINGHAM STAKES SCHEDULE RELEASED

Rockingham Park will present 12 stakes races worth almost \$600,000 in 1998. The centerpiece of the schedule is the June 20 \$200,000 GIII New Hampshire Sweepstakes. Local News, New York:

The New York Racing Association generated \$41,061,000 in direct revenues in 1997, with almost all of the revenues benefitting state and local government. The amount includes \$3,268,000 in profit, \$21,422,000 in pari-mutuel taxes and \$16,371,000 in real estate taxes paid by the Association. "The Thoroughbred industry is important to New York state," said Kenny Noe, Jr, chairman of the board and chief executive officer of NYRA. "It not only contributed the \$40 million, it also provides jobs and the tax revenues generated by those jobs. It is imperative that New York state have a healthy Thoroughbred industry." In addition, total purse money rose 5.2 percent to \$94.4 million from 1996's total of \$89.7 million.

Harvey Pack, the 71-year-old host of the New York Racing Association's daily television recap show "Thoroughbred Action" for 18 years, will make his final appearance on the program Sunday, March 29. Pack also has been host of the weekly "Inside Racing" on Fox Sports New York; his contract for both shows, which expires at the end of March, will not be renewed.

NTRA News:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and EquiSource, LLC have reached an agreement in principle for EquiSource to be the exclusive provider of group purchasing and productivity services for the Thoroughbred racing industry. In addition, the NTRA has announced that it will acquire an equity interest in the service firm. EquiSource was founded last fall by Churchill Downs and UniStar LLC.

Equibase News:

In a joint statement released yesterday, *Daily Racing Form* and Equibase Company have announced an agreement which will standardize racing statistics for the Thoroughbred industry. Details of the agreement provide that the Form will grant an equal right, title and ownership to Equibase for the historical records collected by the DRF prior to 1991. After a brief transition period, DRF will receive its racing data from Equibase under a perpetual, non-exclusive license which allows both companies to package and market the data without restriction. "We are pleased to have finally achieved the goal originally set forth in Equibase's inaugural business plan eight years ago--to provide the Thoroughbred race tracks of North America with a uniform, industry-owned database of racing information and statistics," said Alan Marzelli, Equibase chairman and chief executive officer. "And the fact that DRF should now choose to rely on Equibase data is satisfying confirmation of its accuracy, quality and comprehensiveness."
